DOCTORAL PROGRAMME

Our main objective is to create an inspiring environment for successful doctoral projects by providing excellent supervision and comprehensive training. Our doctoral programme includes interdisciplinary study groups, courses in theory and methods, interdisciplinary research seminars, the annual Graduate Workshop, and an international summer school.

- PhD scholarships for 3.5 years

Application

We welcome applications from students with a very good Master's degree (or equivalent) and whose research interests align with those of the Graduate School. We expect an innovative research project, interest in interdisciplinary exchange, and openness to transnational and spatial perspectives.



The application deadline is usually in November each year. Courses start in April (summer term).

ACADEMIC AND PUBLIC IMPACT

Our main objective is to deliver world class research and train early career researchers for this purpose. We pursue this goal by creating spaces of exchange between scholars at different stages in their career, from different countries, as well as different disciplinary backgrounds.
